Election Time in F2L

The children have been studying a picture of the Houses of Parliament. They discussed the General Election and talked about how grown-ups would be able to vote to decide who went inside and was in charge of making the rules that run our schools, hospitals and police force!

Staff then explained to the children that they would have their own election in the classroom. The children would vote to decide which 'Frozen' character could be displayed on our end cupboard. The children went off to design a poster that would persuade the others to vote for a certain character. The children were then shown the voting form and listened carefully as they were told to place a cross next to the name of the character they wanted to vote for. They then enjoyed placing their crosses next to their chosen character. Next the children folded their voting slips into half before posting them into the ballot box. The class then opened the box and looked at the voting slips. On the Interactive Whiteboard they created a table, and for each vote a star was placed under the character's name. The children carefully watched as the votes built up and discussed who was winning. The class then had to count all the votes. The children identified who came first and second. They discovered that we had a draw for third place with four

Other discussions took place concerning leaders and how important they are and the qualities they must have. Our School Captains, Sarah Durham and Edward Arch were highlighted as displaying these qualities.
