### Sport's Pupil Premium

Our School receives PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

At Cranwell Primary School we understand the importance of developing the whole child through physical education and school sport. At our school we provide opportunities for every child to participate, enjoy, be challenged, and have a shared role within an outstanding school curriculum and school sport map. We aim to develop a sense of personal health and well-being and a desire for lifelong participation in physical activity or competitive sport. Ultimately our vision is to inspire a generation to hold deep to themselves the values of friendship, excellence, respect and maintain a healthy mind and body for their lifelong future in their community.

Cranwell Primary School has received a Sports and PE Grant of £9,750. Details of where our grant has been allocated can be found on our school website.

### Facts & Achievements

During 2014, Cranwell Primary School was awarded Sainsbury's School Games Silver Mark. This was recently presented in a whole school assembly by Andy Allen, from Carre's Grammar School.

The total number of sport club opportunities being offered this year at Cranwell Primary School is 401!

The current number of children attending at least 1 extra-curricular sport club is 169 representing a whopping 52.3% of the school pupils.

The amount of girls participating in Level 1 and Level 2 competition has increased by 20%. Latest figures show that 68% of girls have competed against other schools whereas in the year 2013/2014 the figure was 46%.



More opportunities are available for children to become young leaders. Cranwell School is attending above 90% of the available Level 2 Competitions on offer in the School Sports Partnership.

Opportunities for competition at a younger age are being made available and hopefully will encourage more children to follow into a sport and continue to be healthy individuals into later teen/adult life.

The breadth of sport and skills taught at Cranwell is gradually increasing year on year.

### Football Team Success



The School's football team have performed admirably this year. The team took the honours in both the tournament event in April, and the League trophy which they have been competing for throughout the year.
