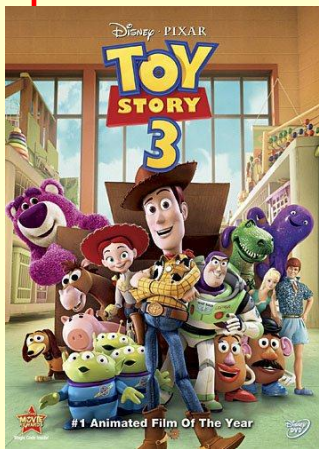
Film Club

Year One Phonics Screening will be taking place during the week commencing 13th June 2016 and is a Government requirement.

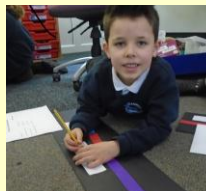
Therefore, please ensure your child is in school during this period. Absences during this time may be classified as unauthorised.
