Snowdrop

Plant a snowdrop in aid of Child Bereavement UK

North Kesteven District Council is delighted to invite families to take part in a Snowdrop Walk in aid of Child Bereavement UK at Whisby Nature Park on Sunday, 11 February 2018.

In partnership with the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust the Snowdrop Walk is now in its 2nd year and will bring families together to remember those children that are no longer with us.

Roseanne Bristow whose daughter was stillborn in 2013 helped start up the walk, she said: "The snowdrop walk is vital for families and individuals to have time to remember, to feel support from their community and most importantly do something positive outdoors, that year on year will become more beautiful as the snowdrops multiply".

A grassed area, off the beaten track at Whisby Nature Park will become an area for those who wish to remember the lives of children they have lost.

Between 12noon and 3pm there will be an opportunity for families to plant snowdrops in memory of someone special who has died. Proceeds will be donated to Child Bereavement UK, which supports families and educates professionals when a baby or child of any age dies or is dying, or when a child is facing bereavement. Snowdrop bulbs will be kindly provided by Pennells Garden Centre in North Hykeham, and will be available on the day for a small donation. Volunteers will also be on hand to help with the planting.

After planting your Snowdrop, you can take a walk around the area to take a moment and remember, or meet others who have been in a similar situation to your own.

There are a range of onsite facilities, including the Boardwalk Café at the Natural World centre.
