Breakfast is £1 per person.

Free School Meals

Is my child eligible?

Your child will be eligible to get free school meals if they are in:

Reception, Year 1 or Year 2

Other year groups

If your child is in Year 3 or older, they may be eligible if you receive certain benefits:

Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Income Support.

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit.

Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190).

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Children who get paid these benefits directly can also get free school meals.

Important: Once you apply, tell your school if you receive any of the above benefits as they can get funding called Pupil Premium.
