## Helping my Child to Write

### Top tips:

- Choose a time when your child isn't tired and when they're not missing out on a favourite activity.
- Give plenty of praise for even small successes.
- Avoid having the television on while you're working together, as it will cause distraction and affect concentration.

 Remember that most Pre-school/Foundation Stage children will not be able to concentrate for a very long time. Ten minutes or so will probably be enough, especially at first. Then build up the time gradually.

· Show appreciation for what your child has achieved. You might even like to put their efforts up on show.

 The more your child experiences writing in different forms, the quicker they will progress, e.g. writing shopping lists, letters or postcards to friends and family or writing about their favourite football team or television programme.
