

Supporting you to understand the new rules



A National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absences, including unauthorised leave of absences in Term Time, is being introduced following changes to the law.

These new government regulations will come into effect from 19th August 2024.

What are these changes?

If a pupil has **10 unauthorised sessions**, which is equal to **5 school days**, within a **10 week period**, a penalty notice may be issued.


This will come under 3 categories: First, Second, and Third offence.



First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.



Third offence and any further offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.





WhatsApp Group Chats




WhatsApp groups can be an incredibly useful communication tool but it can also become quite overwhelming when EVERYONE adds you to a group.

By default, WhatsApp allows ANYONE to add you to a group—they just need your phone number—but you can change this. If you tap on 'Settings' and then go to 'Privacy', one of the options is 'Groups'. This will give you 3







Once you have set this up, anyone who is not in your contacts (or anyone you have selected to exclude) has to send an invite to any new group they add you to—you can then either accept or decline.

This should help give your child some control over what groups they actually want to be involved in and can help them manage groups they don't want to be added to.



Can you help Jack?

Former Cranwell Primary Pupil Racing on the World Stage

Hello! My name is Jack, and I'm a 22-year-old motorcycle racer from Sleaford, Lincolnshire and a proud former student of Cranwell Primary School. Since leaving school, I have qualified as a bricklayer while also pursuing my career as a professional flat track racer, competing in both the British and World Championships.

For the upcoming 2026 season, I am looking for sponsorship and advertising support as I continue to race at the highest level. This year, I was thrilled to be offered the chance to ride the brand-new Triumph TF450 for the Dick Shepherd Triumph team.

A look back at my 2025 season:

The year brought plenty of highs and challenges. Early in the season, my team and I performed strongly, leading both the British and National Championships and running inside the top eight in the World Championship on my Honda 450.

Mid-season, I was offered a supported ride on the new Triumph TF450RC an opportunity too good to turn down. Although switching to a newly developed bike came with risks, my team and I worked incredibly hard. By the end of the season, we secured 2nd place in both the British and National Championships and finished 10th in the FIM World Championship. I'm proud of what we achieved and excited for what lies ahead. As we prepare for 2026, I'll be doing extensive winter testing, trying new parts and riding at a variety of tracks to get the best possible start to the season. I plan to continue racing in the British, National, and World Championships, with even more rounds and countries involved next year.

In January, I'll also be travelling to the USA for two weeks of racing, including events in Pensacola and the Cory Texter Winter Throwdown in Jacksonville an event I'm thrilled to return to.

In 2024, I became British Champion, and with the right support and funding, I'm confident I can bring home more titles on the Triumph. As a former Cranwell Primary School pupil now competing on the world stage, I hope I can inspire younger students to chase their own ambitions.
